Varieties are described below.

**Oroblanco Grapefruit** is a sweet white grapefruit. It is incredibly fragrant and is sweet versus bitter.

The **Meyer Lemon** is less tart than an ordinary store lemon and slightly larger. It can be used like an ordinary lemon for lemonade or for a lemon pie. Improved Meyer Lemon not only produce thin skinned, juicy and sweeter lemons but also make an attractive landscape tree.

**Valencia Oranges** bring benefits of vitamin C with their high juice content, thin skin and few seeds. Its blooms are very fragrant!

**Sweet Georgia Kisses** are the Georgia version of the Seedless Kishu Mandarin. It is one of the most delicious of all the mandarins. The fruit is smaller than a golf ball but super easy to peel, tender and juicy on the tongue, and fragrant and sweet to the nose.

**Key Limes** are great for so many things – they are great for digestion, healthy skin, and heart health. They can be used for cooking, cleaning, and garnishing.

The **Satsuma** is a juicy mandarin that bursts with a rich, mouthwatering sweet taste. It is a zipper peel, meaning the peeling just zips right off.

**Sweet kumquats** are fun to eat around Thanksgiving and Christmas. You eat the whole thing, rind, seeds and all - in one or two bites. The rind has an extraordinary spicy/sweet taste that is almost addictive once you bite into it. They are very cold hardy yet can handle fry-pan hot summers.
